

Principles of the Entrance Exam for Bachelor Studies

Approved by the Academic Senate of the Faculty of CE on April 19, 2013

1. High school graduates who have completed their studies with the school-leaving exam in mathematics and physics and a study average of maximum 2.2 (the last year of high school studies is not taken into account) will be admitted without an entrance exam. This does not apply to those students who have previously attended the Faculty of Civil Engineering of STU and completed part of their studies. In the event that high school graduates have voluntarily passed an external school-leaving exam, they can be admitted only if they obtained a minimum 50% of points.
Note: In the event of passing a school-leaving exam in accordance with the previous regulations and differentiated levels, it is possible only for the level A to be admitted for studies without an entrance exam.
2. The applicants who do not pass a school-leaving exam in mathematics and physics, but have a study average of maximum 1.5 (the last year of high school studies is not taken into account) will be admitted without an entrance exam. This only applies for those students who have previously attended the Faculty of CE of STU and completed a part of their studies.
3. Other applicants have to pass an entrance exam in mathematics and physics with assessed mathematics 50% and physics 50%.
4. The Dean has the authority to decide that the entrance exam for a certain study program can be cancelled.
5. If the number of applicants, who meet the criteria for being admitted without the entrance exam is higher than 90% of the allowable number for a given study program, the Faculty reserves the right to cancel admission without the entrance exam for that study program. In that case all the applicants for the program have to take the entrance exam.
6. The list of the order of admitted students for individual study programs is as follows:
 - The first part of the list is composed of the applicants who are admitted without an entrance exam (paragraphs 1 and 2), which are classified according to their study average in the first three years of their studies in high school.
 - The list of order is complemented with the applicants who are invited to take the entrance exam. They are ranked according to the results of the entrance exam.
 - The applicants who obtain the required number of points determined by the admission committee will be admitted for the given study program.
 - The applicants who have not been admitted to the priority study program (listed first in the application) can be admitted for a substitute study program for which the allowable number of students has not been met.

7. The requirements for the admission of foreign students and Slovak citizens are the same. There is an exception for self-paying applicants for whom the entrance exam is in the form of a colloquium.
8. The applicants whose studies will be held in English need to submit a certificate of English language competence or need to take an entrance exam in the English language (this also applies to self-paying applicants).
9. Allowable numbers for full-time bachelor study programs are determined by the Dean. They are published on the website of the Faculty.
10. These principles come into force on September 1, 2013, and as such they cancel the Principles of the Entrance Exam for Bachelor Studies from May 30, 2012.
