

Principles of the Entrance Exam for Engineering Level Program Studies

1. Graduates of Bachelor study programs who have applied for studies directly following up their previous study programs will be admitted without an entrance exam with the exception of the study program of Building Structures and Architecture (further in the document as "BSA"). The applicants for the BSA study program will be admitted on the basis of their successful passing of a skills test, which is a part of testing the aptitudes for these studies.
2. Other applicants have to pass an oral entrance exam, which is a part of verifying their study skills before an examination board. The entrance exam consists of the subjects which make up the content of the final state exam of the bachelor's study program, which is the basis for the following engineering studies. The extent of the entrance exam is identical with the extent of the particular state exam. The successful completion of the entrance exam is required to be admitted. The examination board will decide on the successful completion of the entrance exam.
3. The list of the order of admitted applicants for the individual study programs at the second (engineering) level has been determined according to the weighted average of the study results in their bachelor study program. In the event of an identical study average, the results of the final state exam or the entrance exam will be taken into account.
4. The list of the order of the applicants for the study program of Building Structures and Architecture will be determined on the basis of their study results and the skills test. The skills test consists of three parts: final term drawing work, studio work I, and studio work II. It is possible to obtain a maximum of 25 points for each part of the skills test. Students who obtain a minimum of 35 points will pass the skills test successfully. It is also possible to obtain another 25 points from the results of their bachelor studies. This means counting the points awarded for the results of their state exams (A – 20 points, B – 15 points, C – 10 points, D – 5 points, E – 0 points) and the points for their weighted average of study results at the bachelor level ($b = 7.5 - 2.5 \cdot \text{WASR}$, where b means the number of awarded points, and WASR means weighted average of the study results). The list of the order of the applicants for the study program of Building Structures and Architecture will be ranked according to the number of points obtained.
5. The requirements for the admission of foreign students and Slovak citizens are the same.
6. If the number of applicants for a certain study program is too small, the Dean has the authority not to open that program. In that case the applicants will be offered some other study program.

7. These principles of the entrance exam for the engineering level program studies were approved by the Academic Senate of the Faculty of Civil Engineering of STU in Bratislava on February 27, 2015.
8. These principles of the entrance exam for the engineering level program studies come into force on the day of their approval by the Academic Senate of the Faculty of Civil Engineering of STU in Bratislava.
9. The principles of the entrance exam for engineering studies dated November 25, 2011, will expire after the approval of the above principles.

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
